Meeting called to order at 11:51 am. Diane led the group in an opening prayer.

Nancy suggested some rules to make the meetings run more efficiently and ensure that all topics can be covered in a timely manner.

Meeting minutes from Feb 12, 2023 were reviewed. Spelling correction to Dominic Crossan's name. Dan moved to accept the minutes with this correction, Olivia seconded. All approved.

Property Committee

- Security 2 options presented to address the needs described during Feb meeting.
 - Solar powered motion detector lights install them near the 2 lantern doors and this will provide lighting after dark for anyone coming through those doors and deter any persons with ill intentions. \$30-\$80/each and easy to install
 - 24-hour monitoring system like Simply Safe \$300-\$400 for installation and ~\$1/day for 24-hour monitoring
 - There was some concern with the 24-hour monitoring system, not only cost but the need to have a St Johns member be always "on call" to deal with any issues. It was noted that this type of system may be overkill considering that there hasn't been a history of issues. Diane also noted that some groups/individuals who use the church require anonymity/discretion and that a camera system may be a concern. Vestry decided to investigate the motion sensor lighting and fixing the dysfunctional doors that started this conversion in Feb.
- Authorization to Spend Topic revisited and Vestry decided that Jerry, as the head of Buildings & Grounds, already has authorization to spend within the B&G budget and for any purchases where there could be a question, consultation first with Senior Warden and then Vestry if needed. No motion needed.

Worship Committee

- Holy Week services
 - Palm Sunday Apr 2 10:00am trial run of "old" altar placement
 - -Help on Sun Mar 26 will be needed to move altars and arrange the front of the church
 - Maundy Thursday Apr 6, 7pm
 - Procession to the Garden of Repose (place where the host is held until the Good Friday service). The Chapel will be transformed into this space as it has been historically.
 - Vigil sign-up sheet will be circulated to get volunteers to "Keep Watch" for as long as there are available people. Mary noted that this is such an important quiet time and that historically there have been many who have been willing to "Keep Watch" through the night.
 - Good Friday Apr 7, 12:00 pm and Stations of the Cross 3:00pm
 - Easter Vigil Apr 8, 8:00pm
 - Potentially 3 baptisms
 - Easter Sunday Apr 9, 10:00am
 - No coffee hour
- Evensong
 - Sunday Mar 19, 4pm
 - Sunday Apr 23, 4pm
- Family Potluck + Worship service moved to May 20
 - Planned in the Chapel/Undercroft, Parish Hall already reserved that day

Outreach Committee

- Easter baskets Olivia has reached out to the shelter for families.
 - Since Easter is close to ICRH, it was suggested that we have Easter goodies for our guests as well as our homebound parishioners
- Restoration House Mar 26 Apr 2
 - Privacy concerns short term fixes to block the Parish Hall windows can be made, privacy within the Parish Hall for each individual will be harder to address and won't be possible before Mar 26. Ideas for this are being considered for implementation before Nov 2023 so that St Johns can host the entire shelter need base of 30-40 people

- ICRH Fundraiser Sat Apr 15, 5pm, Sacred Heart Parish Hall, \$30 per person or \$240 per table
 - Dinner, Fellowship and Paddle Auction
 - St Johns asked to put together a basket for the auction
 - St Johns will purchase a table
- Campus Ministry Recital scheduled Mar 25, 3:00pm, St Johns
 - "Open Mic" format plus a reception
- Good News Garden seeds have been purchased and will be started this week at Emmaus
- Care Packages for St John's college students letting our students know that they are still part of St Johns
 - 4 students currently; Emma, Matthew, Matthew and Zach
 - Nancy and Jen to put something together

Education Committee

- Safe Church training there are still many who haven't committed to a date. Lara is keeping the list and Mekeila is keeping the completion certificates in the office.
- Diocese Sunday School Curriculum Mary Ellen likes the Lenten series and after completion of the 6-week curriculum, she will provide her recommendation for purchasing the full year curriculum. With the Diocesan subsidy, the cost would be ~\$1.50/child for the full year.
- Vacation Bible School It was noted that beginning in 2023 may be a stretch given the work that goes into planning and execution so the goal is to put together a program to start in 2024. Lara noted that this is a great opportunity to not only support our Parish youth but also others in the community to carry out our mission and grow the church.

- Endowment fund move from Isabella Bank & Trust to the new Diocese investment fund has been completed.

Rector's Report

- College for Congregational Development Diane, Jillian Davidson and Lara Raisanen will attend
- Website updated needed, will be discussed during April meeting.
- Diocesan Clergy Retreat May 16 18, Diane will be away
- Diocese is supporting local Pride celebrations by providing funds needed to sponsor events, Ulana was noted as the individual who may know best what is planned in Isabella County and how to get involved. Diane wants to take full advantage of this support.

New Business

- Digital sign 2 new quotes received, committee decided to go with the Mega Technology quote.
 - \$22,000 (does not include electrical work and any brick work that may be needed to harmonize the sign with the church's exterior)
 - There are still some decisions to be made here but, in an effort to make a final decision and begin planning for implementation by July 1 (date by which we are obligated to spend the Whitmore Grant funds received in 2022), Dan suggested that all necessary details be vetted through email and a final vote to take place at Apr Vestry meeting.

Next meeting April 16, 2023 (moved from April 9 due to Easter holiday)

Diane led the closing prayer.

Below is a summary of operating fund activity through the end of February (16.67%).

Operating fund receipts over (under) expenditures......\$ 6,952.33

Estimated giving amounts are up this month due to several parishioners paying their entire estimated giving amount in February.

In February, we moved our Endowment Fund from Isabella Bank to The Episcopal Diocese of Western Michigan Diocesan Investment Fund. This fund includes the diocese's funds and the endowment funds of several other churches in our diocese. With the merging of funds, we paying less on service fees and expect to see a higher return. The new fund is managed by State Street Global Advisors and we will follow the same investment strategy and the Diocese. We will receiving quarterly reports showing our portion of the gains/losses based on out percentage of assets in the account.

Special projects:

External Sign Upgrade: The sign committee is evaluating proposals from Stewart Signs and Mega LED Technology. Grants and funds collected account for \$13,917.17 being raised to date.

Columbarium Expansion: We are waiting for spring for the installation of our columbarium expansion. If you are interested in a niche, please contact Pamela Dingman for more information.


