Canadian Thanksgiving and Indigenous People's Day


There were 23 of us gathered to share a Canadian Thanksgiving dinner - and to celebrate a Eucharist for Indigenous People's Day. Both were wonderful!

September 2023 Financial Report

Below is a summary of operating fund activity through the end of September (75.00%).

Unrestricted operating fund receipts	\$ 157,255.20 (79.65% of budget)
Unrestricted operating fund expenditures	160,396.35 (73.42% of budget)
Operating fund receipts over (under) expenditures	\$ (3,141.15)

Income is considerably down for September. In 2023, we adopted a deficit budget, balancing it with surplus funds from COVID grants and credits. We will not have that luxury in 2024.

The Stewardship Campaign will commence soon. Our goal is to develop a balanced budget this year. To do so we need your prayers. Prayers that giving is strong and gives us the resources to strengthen existing programs and explore new ones. Prayers for the tough decisions the vestry must make to balance the budget.


